

SOCIAL FISHING COMP RULES: B.O.A.T. CLUB INC.

1. Fish will be weighed in under four separate divisions:
 - . • Opens Adults
 - . • Learners Adults
 - . • Junior Boy's
 - . • Junior Girl's
2. All fish will be measured and weighed if **deemed necessary**. Any ties will be allocated points from two places together divided evenly; i.e. first and second = $35\text{pts} / 2 = 17.5$ pts each.
3. Comp starts at 5pm Friday and finishes Sunday 12pm. You do not have to sign in first. You can weigh in any time you like as long as member witness not family is present. Comp time may vary on long weekends as per discretion of Fishing Captain.
4. Should a member leave the event before its conclusion or chooses not to attend the weigh in they **MUST** ensure the Fishing Captain has been advised.

6. Conditions concerning cancellation of an event will be by the competitor contacting the Fishing Captain to be sure of the situation.
7. All boats must carry the required safety equipment stipulated by the Department of Harbours and Marine.
8. Inside fishing is to be conducted within the waters of Moreton Bay and the rivers entering the Bay. Outside will be north of the spit and south of the Pin Bar
9. Surf fishing will be included which will allow fishing from the ocean side of South Stradbroke Island.
10. To be eligible to win a championship trophy Members must have attended a minimum of 3 of organised fishing events
11. Points will be given for the 3 biggest fish of each species that are equal to or exceed the minimum **LEGAL LENGTH** as set by the QLD Department of Fisheries. Bag limits must also be obeyed and

considered per trip.

POINTS ARE ALLOCATED AS FOLLOWS

Points will be allocated to each person as follows:

- . • 10 point for ugliest. (Fish that is!)
 - . • 10 point for biggest fish overall.(most cm over legal size only fish with size limits qualify)
 - . • 5 points at the weigh in
 - . • 20 points for biggest
 - . • 15 points for second
 - . • 10 points for third
12. ONLY 3 fish of each species will be weighed per member and will be measured from nose to end of tail.
